

- Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple Store or Google Play or from the links at <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. To report an absence, select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- Use the SafeArrival website, <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. To report an absence, select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 1-855-756-2797 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24/7 and are incredibly easy to use. If you do not report your child's absence in advance, the school will have to contact you to ensure your child is safely in your care.
