Just a reminder that **Annual Registration Update forms are now due**. Thanks to those who have returned them. If you have not, please do so as soon as possible.

Note that **Fall Into Funk has been cancelled** due to new provincial COVID regulations.

Parents signed up for SchoolCash should receive notification on Wednesday regarding **fees**. If you have not already done so, please sign up for SchoolCash by visiting https://wildrose.schoolcashonline.com/. All fees are due mid-November and should be paid through SchoolCash online. Grades 7 & 8 Band parents should have received a notice regarding a reduction in their fees via email on Friday. In order to better monitor the impact of illness on the school, we ask that parents please be sure to note the **type of absence** (e.g. Illness, Appointment, etc.) when reporting their child's absence in SchoolMessenger.

The **new provincial COVID regulations** came into effect rather quickly and we appreciate everyone's patience as we implement new protocols in order to comply with these new mandates. The two immediate impacts were masking and cohorting our grade 6's. We appreciate your understanding as we implement practices we all wish weren't required.

Students adapted to the new **masking protocols** quickly. We are doing what we did last year. Everyone wears a mask in common areas like hallways and bathrooms. In the classroom, teachers allow students to remove their masks as long as everyone is seated separately and facing the same direction. Students are not required to wear a mask outdoors nor when engaged in physical activity (e.g. Phys. Ed.).

Cohorting the grade 6's has required us to make some changes to our schedule. Grade 6 students now have separate recesses from the grades 7 & 8 students. We're still working out some of the other details around Band and extra-curricular activities, but we don't anticipate any significant challenges at this time.
