

Rob is a published author, with seven novels currently in print. He has travelled to twenty-seven countries, speaks four languages, and has acted in multiple on-stage musicals in the community. He is an avid hunter and outdoorsman, is a marathon runner, and is working towards his black belt in karate.

Rob grew up primarily in Calgary, though he relocated to Vancouver for high school, and remained there to attend the University of British Columbia for his Bachelor of Arts in English Literature and World History.

Following his graduation from UBC, Rob moved to Japan, where he taught English as a foreign language for two years. This introduced him to the love of teaching he has maintained ever since. Upon his return to Canada, he attended the University of Alberta to gain his Bachelor of Education. It was there that he met his wife, who shared both his love of travel and his love of teaching. They married in 2007 and have twin daughters.

Upon finishing his B.Ed, Rob and his wife moved to Rocky Mountain House as he needed to be closer to the mountains. He began his teaching career at West Central High School, teaching English Language Arts, Social Studies and Outdoor Education and coaching football and rugby for the next twelve years.
