Items of Note

This is just a friendly reminder that, for their safety, students require a parent, guardian, or emergency contact (as listed in their student records) to physically **sign out** students in the main office. In rare or occasional circumstances, we'll accept an email from a parent or guardian, but not on a regular basis. We need to be assured the child is safely in the hands of a responsible adult approved of by their parents or legal guardians.

The annual **ski trip** is scheduled for March 12 at Nakiska (grade 7/8 basketball divisionals was moved to March 13 to accommodate this). Invitations have been sent home with students who are in good academic standing, have good attendance, and whose fees are up to date. Parents volunteering to chaperone must have the volunteer form submitted by February 7. The student forms are due back no later than February 10. Completed chaperone criminal record checks must be in the office by February 24.

Nobody said parenting was going to be easy. While every stage of child development presents its own challenges, raising adolescents and teens can be particularly demanding.
