Items of Note

It's a **busy week ahead**. Grade 8's are off to Wetaskiwin on Monday for their trip to the Reynolds Museum. The Band Spring Concert is on Thursday evening. Grade 6's continue to write PATs on Thursday & Friday. Friday is also Panther P.R.I.D.E. day--wear school swag or school colours (red, black, & white) to show your school spirit.

The final **Grade 6 PAT** is June 17. Students should arrive well-rested and on time for these provincial tests.

As we near the end of the year, teachers are calculating whether students are making their grade or not. When a student is "promoted," they have met the majority of curricular outcomes and are prepared for the next grade. Their report card comment should note they have been "**promoted**." However, if your child's report card indicates they have been "**placed**" into the next grade, this means they have NOT achieved the required

curricular outcomes. In other words, they have not made their grade or they have failed. We don't typically retain students (have students repeat a grade) anymore because it does not improve student achievement and leads to the child dropping out. However, being placed into the next grade does mean they will struggle in coming years and will need to work extra hard to be successful. So, to be clear, if your child's report card says they have been "placed," this means they did not have a successful school year.
